IMPORTANT NOTICE:

This document has been prepared for the Society of Martial Arts for the purpose of providing a uniform approach to grading issues within its membership.

Throughout this document the terminology used is relative to the main Japanese martial arts of karate, ju-jutsu and judo.

Chinese, Korean and other martial arts styles have their own terminologies. However, to keep the document simple and easy to understand these have not been mentioned.

Wherever possible the closest terms in other martial arts styles may be substituted for the terminology used in this text.

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SOCIETY OF MARTIAL ARTS (SOMA)

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These rules are to be used as a guide for grading or rank promotions of members within SOMA to provide a uniform, across-the-board and fair, unbiased approach.

RULE 1: THE APPLICANT MUST BE A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING:

NO "new" member will be elevated in rank without first being a member of SOMA in good standing for a **MINIMUM** period of **12 months**. This will address, to some extent, "grade and leave" rank hunters and "grade hurdlers" from other organizations.

RULE 2: APPLICATION FOR GRADING PROMOTION:

2.1 An individual application (see Rule 4) will be received in good faith by the Grading Panel (see Rule 9) and a decision will be made within one calendar month of its merit or otherwise, after its presentation and discussion at the next scheduled SOMA Board meeting. Depending on timing this could therefore require up to two months.

2.2 An individual may be nominated or recommended by a more senior rank and be seconded by a more senior rank. Such applications will carry more weight and be considered more favourably than if the individual applied only by himself or herself.

RULE 3: RANK APPLICATIONS SHOULD ONLY BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNIVERSALLY ACCEPTED "AGE AND EXPERIENCE" MATRIX (SEE MATRIX BELOW):

In general, applications and recommendations will be more favourably looked upon if the following age and experience requirements are met.

MINIMUM AGE:	MINIMUM YEARS (*)	MAXIMUM RANK
16	3	1 st Dan or Degree
18	5	2 nd Dan or Degree
21	8	3 rd Dan or Degree
25	12	4 th Dan or Degree
30	17	5 th Dan or Degree
36	23	6 th Dan or Degree
43	30	7 th Dan or Degree
51	38	8 th Dan or Degree
60	47	9 th Dan or Degree
70	57	10 th Dan or Degree

(*) Years are to be CONTINUOUS years of TRAINING and TEACHING and will need to be evidenced in a resume (with proof) unless otherwise known by the Grading Panel. No breaks in training are allowed when counting minimum years.
